

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Stuart Reid - Author Visit

We will be hosting a visit from the award-winning Scottish author Stuart Reid on Wednesday 17th November 2021.

Stuart's first book won the Silver Medal at the Forward National Literature Awards. His books were written to inspire children to read for pleasure, and Stuart's latest book 'Grandpa Jock and the Incredible Iron-Bru-Man Incident' was launched at the Edinburgh Festival.

Pupils can purchase books on the day, all signed by the author, with a personal dedication to each child. Book prices are £7 each, two for £12, or a school special offer of five books for £20.

During the half term, the main unit of our new mobile classroom arrived in five separate parts and was assembled on site. Work is in progress to ensure it is fully ready for use and we eagerly await the grand opening in a few weeks time.


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Newcastle University STEM Outreach

Year 5s enjoyed the visit from STEM outreach ambassadors (Newcastle University) at the end of last term as they took part in recreating how our wonderful blue planet was formed.

There were spectacular demonstrations from the ambassadors, ranging from elephant toothpaste to setting fire to bubbles filled by gas and the pupils loved it.

This fits in with the Earth and Space topic we are studying at the moment.





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Weather & Climate Club

Last half term the enthusiastic members of our Year 7 Weather and Climate club studied the links between carbon dioxide and climate change.

We have learned how to test for the gas with lime water and took the opportunity of using some dry ice in school to discuss how carbon dioxide is warming the climate, what is happening as a result of global warming and how we can raise awareness and take climate action.

As part of the Royal Society's Tomorrow's Climate Scientists, the club have just been confirmed as having a place in the Society's student conference in February 2022 - we have lots to do before then, including running a mock climate conference across school in parallel with COP26 in Glasgow





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Ponteland Rugby Festival

The sun shone and the atmosphere amongst our teams was wonderful when the school was represented at the Ponteland Rugby Festival.

There was a definite air of excitement amongst the players and staff being our first sporting fixture of the academic year.

All the skills that have been imparted by the PE department and our rugby coach, Michael, were put to good practise on the pitches.

What was particularly noteworthy was the team spirit amongst all players and the desire to encourage and support each other throughout the matches.





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Elementary, My Dear Watson

Year 8 and 7WT had a visit from the Newcastle University STEM Outreach team before breaking up for half-term.

The interactive workshop, entitled 'Elementary, My Dear Watson', inspired scientific wonder and awe with explosions of hydrogen, a whoosh bottle, bubbles of dry ice and freezing objects in liquid nitrogen.

The session, run by Dr Peter Hoare, linked to the Year 8 topic of Chemical Reactions and the Year 7 topic of Atoms and Elements.





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
Natural History Museum - Dragon's Den

7FP and 8J have been helping the Natural History Museum in London trial a new educational workshop based on Dragon's Den.

Pupils were placed in fictional organisations to role-play a decision making process on how to award funding to different research projects. They had an online briefing from Cristina in London and then listened to three candidates pitch their research ideas.

Each team was then given three blank cheques and had up to £1 million (imaginary!) which they could give to their favourite idea, split between projects or keep for themselves.

The ideas included cryogenic seed banks, gaming outreach workshops to promote understanding of environmental issues, farming support for developing countries and an expedition to the Antarctic.

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Charity Apple Pressing
