PSHE in the Autumn Term

Corbridge School

At Corbridge Middle we use the Jigsaw PSHE scheme. This scheme is designed to connect the pieces of Personal, Social, Health and Wellbeing education together. The programme teaches young children and young people emotional literacy, social and lifelong skills, RSE/RSHE and resilience in an age-appropriate manner. The Jigsaw scheme is based on a spiral curriculum which means that topics, subjects or themes are revisited throughout the course. A spiral curriculum is not simply the repetition of a topic taught. It requires also the deepening of it, with each successive encounter building on the previous one.

Last half term our pupils covered the topic of 'Being Me in My World.'-Who am I and how do I fit?

Next half term pupils will cover the topic of 'Celebrating Difference.'-Having a respect for the similarities and differences that we have. Anti-Bullying and being unique.

Staff will also cover other topics that might arise along the way and that need discussing in school.

CMS EcoCommittee



The Corbridge Middle School EcoCommittee had its first meeting this half term. Fifteen pupils with at least one representative from each class shared their passion for protecting and enriching our environment.

The student-led group is working towards EcoSchool Green Flag status so completed an audit of seven areas: Biodiversity & Nature, Climate Change, Energy, Global Citizenship, Health & Wellbeing, Litter, Marine and Coast and the School Grounds.

They identified there was definitely room for improvement for each area and are putting together a list of ideas for how to progress. Their energy and enthusiasm is incredible - they really want to make a positive impact on the school and the local community.



Living Organisms in Science



Year 6 are continuing their studies on living organisms in science.

They have conducted an investigation on how the amount of sugar affects the volume of yeast.

Hands-on practical work will develop their working scientifically skills such as planning a method, making careful measurements, recording data, drawing conclusions and teamwork.

They were amazed that yeast is a type of fungi, that too much salt or sugar is detrimental to its ability to reproduce and that cooking bread kills the organism.
