





Corbridge Middle School is a popular 9-13 middle school situated on the edge of the village of Corbridge in the beautiful Tyne Valley. It is twenty miles west of the vibrant city of Newcastle upon Tyne. Corbridge Middle school is a special place because of the community of people who are a part of it. The children are our best ambassadors; they work hard, behave well and care for each other. We are very proud of the high academic standards we achieve and the happy, calm and purposeful atmosphere in the school. The effective partnership between staff and parents ensures that the personal development of the children is a priority during this crucial stage of transition from childhood to adolescence. We believe that happy children will be successful learners.

The school day begins at 08:45 and finishes at 15:30 Monday to Friday. We benefit from large attractive grounds and excellent facilities. We have specialist staff in every subject who work together creatively to deliver a curriculum which engages and enthuses children of all abilities. The school is three form entry with 361 pupils on the roll. The majority of pupils transfer here from one of our four feeder first schools, but a significant number choose to travel from County Durham because of the reputation of the school. We are one of three middle schools that feed into Queen Elizabeth High School and have constructive communication and working practices with all the schools in the Hexham Partnership.

So what do we offer your child?

The Basics

We accept children into Year 5 from both First Schools and Primary Schools.

We are able to accommodate up to 90 pupils per year in 3 form classes.

Pupils are taught by ability for Maths and English and by form class for most other subjects. Practical subjects like Art, Music, Food Science and Design Technology may be taught in smaller classes. We have both Primary specialist teachers and subject specialists who are able to cater for the full range of ability.

Pastoral Care, Behaviour and safety

Our work begins as soon as we know your child will be joining us. We work closely with your child's current school to get to know as much as we can about your child to support their successful transition. We operate a very popular "buddy" system for all new children into our school.

Every person working in our school knows that the safety and happiness of your child is paramount. From the minute they arrive at school, to when they leave, we will do all that we can to ensure that they are safe, and feel safe and are enjoying themselves.

Every child has a form teacher who will see your child at least twice a day. In Year 5 the form teachers will also teach certain subjects to their form class. This allows the teachers to get to know their pupils well. The form teacher is responsible for the day to day pastoral care and organisational matters and will usually be the first point of contact for parents.

We have high expectations for behaviour for learning which are shared with pupils and parents. Our rigorous procedures make sure that rewards and consequences are clear. Learning

From Years 5 to 8 children will benefit from specialist teachers in many of their subjects. They will also have access to specialist facilities in subjects like Design Technology, Food Science, Art and Science and peripatetic music teachers for instrumental lessons and ensembles.

We have an exciting curriculum with plenty of enrichment activities such as inter school competitions, visits and visitors, all aimed at sparking curiosity and a love of learning.

We are passionate about teaching and learning and believe education is about developing the whole person socially, emotionally and spiritually as well as academically. In Key Stage 2 the PSHE and Religious Education curriculum is taught each Friday afternoon by form tutors in a nurturing environment where pupils are encouraged to engage and ask questions. In Key Stage 3 the students spend Friday afternoons involved in our 'Enrichment Project' which comprises activities such as drama, gardening, sports leaders, digital photography and CREST awards. Through these activities we hope to cover the Citizenship curriculum, promote the school values and 'light their fire!'

We strongly believe that to achieve the best academic standards we must teach the 'whole child'. Our Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural curriculum underpins all that we do.

A Typical School Day

School opens at 8.50am

All children follow a timetable, moving around the school for some of their 5 lessons so that they can benefit from specialist teachers and specialist classrooms.

Morning Break is 10.55 -11.10am

There is a tuck shop available in the dining room, offering a range of healthy snacks and drinks.

Lunch Time is 12.05 - 1.05pm

There are a wide variety of clubs available ranging from sport, music, art, games, friendship club and even a Lego club! Lunch is served in our dining room. You can choose on a day to day basis whether you would like your child to have a packed lunch or a school dinner. A "cashless" system is in operation.

School finishes at 3.30pm

'Pupils achieve well during their time in the school. They join in Year 5 with standards that are mostly around those expected for their age. They make good progress from their starting points and reach standards in reading, writing and mathematics that are above the expectations for their age by the end of Year 8.'

Transport

Many of our pupils travel to and from school by bus. At the end of the school day there are several members of staff on duty to ensure that your child is safely escorted to the correct bus. For those living in catchment, transport arrangements are organised by Northumberland County Council, School Transport Department whose telephone number is 0345 600 6400. A private school bus service operates from County Durham directly to our school. More information is available from Mrs Harvey, our Support Manager.

Girls

- Dark grey skirt or trousers A special note about trousers which should not be 'fashion trousers' i.e. wide, long or low cut at the waist. Traditional, formal school trousers are required.


