Understanding the levels on your child's report

End of Key Stage 2

Level 4 represents achievement at the nationally expected standard for most 11-year-olds in Year 6, which is the end of Key Stage 2.

Levels 3 and below represent achievement below the nationally expected standard and Level 5 represents achievement above the nationally expected standard.

End of Key Stage 3

Level 5 and 6 represent achievement at the nationally expected standard for most 14-year-olds in Year 9 which is the end of Key Stage 3.

Levels 4 and below represent achievement below the nationally expected standard and Levels 7 and above represent achievement above the nationally expected standard.

In other year groups, to be in line with the national expectations, a rough guide would be:

Year 5	Level 3 to 4
Year 6	Level 4
Year 7	Level 4 to 5
Year 8	Level 5

As many children do not begin studying French until they are in Year 5, levels achieved may be lower.

Year 5	Level 2 to 3
Year 6	Level 3
Year 7	Level 3 to 4
Year 8	Level 4
